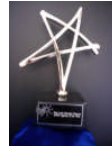
## 2009-2010 Season in Review

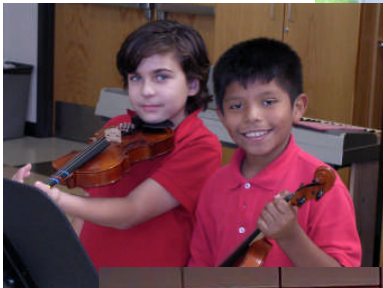
